The LTF is required to have 51 percent parent membership. Other members of the LTF include representatives from Appalachia Intermediate Unit 8, an educational service provider for Bedford, Blair, Cambria, and Somerset Counties; school district representatives and regional special education service agencies.

Parent(s) of a student having a disability are invited to become a member of the LTF.

Membership is easy. To become a member of the LTF: (1) attend two LTF meetings in SY 2020-2021 and (2) request to become a member.

There is never a cost to attend or to become a member of the LTF.

Any parent, local school district representative or community provider serving individuals with disabilities are welcomed, encouraged to attend and to become a member of the LTF.
